# FINANCIAL REPORTS

## **THE CLUB IS REPORTING A SURPLUS OF \$38,188 FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31 OCTOBER 2022. THIS IS A VERY PLEASING OUTCOME GIVEN THE PRESSURES THE BUDGET HAS BEEN SUBJECT TO, UPON RETURN TO FIRST FULL PLAYING SEASON OF OPERATING ACTIVITIES SINCE 2019. THE CLUB REMAINS IN A STRONG FINANCIAL POSITION AND IS DEBT FREE.**

Total income for the year was \$1,447,739 up 35% on the previous year. A significant increase in Fundraising Activities income (up 290% to \$384,813), due to a combination of the 2021 Finals Lunch being held in December 2021 (2022 financial year) and numerous other Club functions being held in 2022 that were not held in prior year due to covid and the 2021 season concluding at midpoint of season. Home Gate & Sponsorship income also increased (up 40% to \$412,183). This increase was due to both increased sponsorship drive in 2022 and increased number of home games played with the completion of season, unlike prior season.

Total expenditure for the year was \$1,409,551 up 31% on the previous year. Increases in expenditure were incurred in Rugby Operations (up 37% to \$698,322), and Fundraising Activities (up 70% to \$287,091). Rugby Operations expenditure was due to completion of full season of activities in connection to medical program (physio, doctor's, strapping tape), a return to full professional coaching and support staff, and increased investment in SUFC Women's and Junior's programs. Fundraising Activities expenditure was up due to combination of 2021 Finals Lunch held in December 2021 (2022 financial year) due to covid, and the return of many other Club functions this season.

With the carry forward of net positive retained surpluses from prior years, the Club remains debt free and is in a sound financial position.

The Club's robust financial position is due to the contribution and efforts of many. The Club is indebted to the continued support of its major sponsor, Buildcorp, as well as the long list of associate sponsors. The Club is also grateful for the support of Sydney University Sport and Fitness, the Sydney University Football Club Foundation, the Friends of

Sydney University, as well as the Club's Gold Members and supporters. The contribution of these organisations and key stakeholders is greatly appreciated. This collective support is essential in ensuring the Club is in a strong financial position to provide the infrastructure, facilities and programs necessary to support the players and coaches and is a key factor in maintaining the Club's on-field success.

I also wish to acknowledge the great work and leadership provided by the Club's Executive General Manager **Jack Farrer**. Jack, was exceptionally well supported by Operations, Marketing & Events Manager, **Kirsty Stevens**. Thank you also to finance team at Sydney University Sport and Fitness for their support. Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the President, **David Lyons** for his leadership of the Club this year.

# FOUNDATION REPORT

## THE SYDNEY UNIVERSITY FOOTBALL CLUB FOUNDATION (SUFCF) WAS ESTABLISHED IN 2003 TO SUPPORT THE ONGOING RUNNING OF THE CLUB AND TO ENABLE IT TO COMPETE AT THE HIGHEST LEVEL.

A donor program was established and has been in existence for 19 years. The proceeds from the program have accumulated a dedicated capital fund, the balance of which stands at \$3.93 million on 30 June 2022. A portion of the Fund's investment earnings are distributed annually to the Club for the specific purpose of supporting the Club and its players in achieving the highest levels of success in both academic and sporting endeavours.

The Fund is professionally managed by Ord Minnett Ltd, in accordance with an approved investment mandate and an agreed asset allocation of Australian and International equities, interest bearing securities, term deposits and cash, under the overall direction of the SUFCF Investment Committee (IC) and members of the SUFCF Board of Directors. Our thanks go to the members of the IC for their time and effort during the year and to **Paul Reid** and **Tony Mulveney** of KPMG who kindly donate their time and expertise to the Foundation to manage and complete the financial accounts.

After a promising start, the 2022 financial year ended up being a bruising affair after Russia invaded Ukraine, triggering an inflationary outbreak, which central banks responded to with force.

By 30 June, cash was the only major asset class in positive territory – a meagre 0.1%. This was only the second time in three decades that cash was the top performer. The last time was in 2008, in the depths of the global financial crisis when it returned 7.3%.

The Australian share market was next best, falling 6.5% on a total return basis. The rally in commodity prices and Australia's larger weighting to resource stocks helped our market outperform international shares, which fell 9.5%. Rising interest rates clearly had a negative impact on bond values, with the fixed interest category dropping 10.5%. A long period of low interest rates drove property valuations to their peak, so when rates started to rise, expected valuations reversed, driving the listed property sector 12.3% lower.

Table 1 outlines the performance of the fund over the past 1, 3 & 5 years. It is pleasing to see that the Foundation Portfolio has comfortably beaten the Balanced Fund Benchmark in all the years as well as beating the 5-year target (4%+CPI), set by the Investment Policy, of 6.6% by 1% per annum.

The Australian Equities component of the Fund returned 12.2% per annum over the 5 years compared to the ASX 100 Accumulation Index which returned 7.2% per annum. The balanced fund benchmark returned 5.7% per annum over the same period.

Table 2 outlines the earnings of the Fund over the last 5 years. Net earnings of \$422,500 for FY22 was higher than previous years mainly due to improved company performance combined with taking advantage of the number of off-market buy backs as well as the BHP special dividend.

The Foundation was able to make a distribution of \$100,000 to the Club for FY22. Distributions made to the Club since the Foundation's inception now total \$1,956,000.

On behalf of the Foundation, I would like to thank the generosity of our valued donors who have made donations over the past 19 years. It is important to note that the Club

continues to need the support of more donors. Following on from the excellent platform laid by previous Chairmen, it is a great honour to continue to serve as Chairman of SUFCF. I am privileged to have such a capable Board and I greatly appreciate the efforts in recent years to raise additional funds to provide greater financial stability to the Club. I am confident the legacy we have built will continue to grow to ensure the Foundation continues to support the broader goals of the Club.

## AFTER THE HIGHS OF THE 2021 SEASON BUT WITHOUT A SENSE OF CLOSURE THAN WE WOULD NORMALLY COME AFTER A SEASON AND A FINALS SERIES, SEASON 2022 WAS GOING TO BE FAR DIFFERENT FROM ANY OTHER THAT WE ENCOUNTERED IN OUR CAREERS.

Coupled this with a huge amount of turnover in our playing and support staff, the threat of COVID still hovering over our program and a once in a century weather event it meant that we had to be adaptable and present in the moment like never before to be successful.

# MEDICAL REPORT

## FIRST AND FOREMOST, THE MEDICAL TEAM WOULD LIKE TO THANK SUFC FOR THE RESOURCES THEY PROVIDE US WITH TO BE ABLE TO WORK WITH PLAYERS AND STAFF TO PROVIDE THE HIGHEST LEVEL OF CARE FOR THE PLAYERS OF THE CLUB.

Season 2022 brought with it a couple of new faces but also plenty of continuity through the majority of the medical team. **George Guyatt** was Head Physiotherapist, **Chris Russell** Colts Physiotherapist and **Lizzy Donnelly** Women's Physiotherapist. We warmly welcomed and found great continuity with the Club's new doctor in **Dr Tom Cooney**. The players and staff were very grateful having Tom around throughout the season. Dr **James Pearlman** was more involved with the Club this year, after assisting us over the past couple of years, and he was in attendance at the majority of game days for the Colts group across the year. We would also like to thank **Dr Nathan Gibbs** for his ongoing assistance and guidance throughout the year.

It was great for the players, staff and medical team to be able to see out a full season without the burden of Covid. The first fully uninterrupted season since 2019 had its ups and downs from an injury perspective and we saw some interesting changes in injury profile compared to the last two years.

## SERIOUS INJURIES OF SEASON 2022

We always like to mention players who suffered significant injuries that caused them to miss long periods or have their season ended by their injuries. It is always tough for players to be ruled out for a season and the medical team sees the work they put in on their journey back to playing. We are always proud of the effort of these players and appreciate the challenges they face.

This year saw a very unusual occurrence at the club which has caused reflection amongst the medical team. This year saw six ACL injuries, an unenviable number that is a major increase on the past 3-4 years. ACL injuries cause concern because of the fact that many of these injuries are considered preventable. The typical ACL rupture occurs in a non-contact mechanism, e.g. a player attempts to side step

or react to an attacking player, their knee buckles as their ACL ruptures. Typically, the club has seen 1-2 of these per season over the past 3 years. These injuries are considered preventable due to the fact that training load, player strength, fatigue/fitness and technique relate to these injuries. Unusually, the six players that all sustained season ending ACL injuries were injured in contact mechanisms. That is, another player making contact with their leg causing their ACL to rupture. Five out of the six injuries were sustained by an opposition player making front on, or side on contact to the knee causing traumatic force to rupture the ACL. The remaining ACL injury occurred when a player was making a tackle that caused momentum to carry him through the air causing an awkward landing that ruptured his ACL. This is a good reflection on the program considering none of these injuries were considered preventable (and actually showing us a reduction in preventable ACL injuries). Such a large spike however was unusual and there is the potential that deep soft surfaces meant that players feet may have caught in the ground more than normal, causing more load to be taken at the knee. This is an environmental factor that was obviously caused by the massive rainfall we experienced across the year.

The players who sustained ACL injuries this year and had their seasons ended were: **Saul Lewis, Kalani Pilcher, Ethan Etienne, Bilal Abdelwahab, Daniel Breden** and **Regan Watts**. They have all commenced their rehabilitation and are progressing well.

The remaining players that suffered season ending injuries were:

- **Ben Morton** – Shoulder reconstruction surgery
- **Sean Hasegawa** – Hamstring rupture and surgery
- **Sione Taufui** – Hamstring rupture
- **James Dargaville** – MCL injury
- **Connor O'Shea** - Gr3 Calf strain
- **George Poolman** – Syndesmosis injury and surgery
- **Jamie Clark** – Syndesmosis injury
- **Paddy Burns** – Tibial fracture and surgery
- **Tom Morrison** – Thumb fracture and surgery
- **Rob Ireland** – Ankle fracture/dislocation and surgery
- **Stefano Hunt** – Turf Toe

Special mention to the players below who returned from long term rehab or suffered a significant proportion of missed games this season.



- **Connor O'Shea** - Returned from ACL surgery but was unfortunate enough to suffer soft tissue injuries that ended his season.
- **Josh Schwager** – Returned from shoulder surgery and multiple soft tissue injuries. Josh worked incredibly hard across the year to return for the finals series, he sadly suffered a major rib injury on the Thursday night that ruled him out of the Grand Final.
- **Aidan Wearne** – Played out the season following major ankle, knee then shoulder injuries.
- **Alex O'Reilly** - Returned to play after a long journey full of complications post ankle surgery.
- **Sione Taufui** – Had his season cut short by a hamstring injury having already overcome a major knee injury and unusual, high grade hamstring injury early in the year.
- **Angus Allen** – Suffered a significant nerve injury that is a very challenging injury to overcome. He was able to return and play out the season.
- **Bodhi Chand** – Had his season ended by a long-term hamstring injury.
- **Henry Clunies-Ross** – The man who defies modern medicine, he suffered a ruptured spleen which all but ruled him out for the year. He was able to return for the semi and grand final, playing an integral part in the Club's Shute Shield victory.
- **George Clark, Will Clements and Finn McDonagh** all overcame long term shoulder injuries to return in season for the Club.

## SEASON 2022 INJURY STATISTICS

Being the first full season of rugby in three years, the injury stats below are dominated by contact injuries. A majority of the season was impacted by wet weather and poor field conditions, this led to matches that were played tight and had a high rate of collisions. Poor field quality also saw an increase in foot and ankle injuries and as discussed above, likely contributed to the high rate of knee injuries this season.

As mentioned above, games were typically slower forward pack dominated games. This inevitably leads to more collision and this season we saw a large spike in AC injuries at the shoulder which often cause a minimum of 7 days of time lost due to their debilitating nature. There was also a significant increase in nerve injuries at the shoulder as well as higher rates of concussion when compared to season 2021. Whilst there was a significant increase in shoulder injuries and their severity, time taken for rehabilitation closely reflected our historical data with shoulder injuries taking on average 17.86 days to rehabilitate compared to 16.10 in 2021.

One of the most detrimental injuries (as often occurs) this season was hamstring injuries. We were unfortunate in the fact that there were three very high-grade hamstring injuries that occurred when players were pilfering a ball (unlike the usual sprinting injury that occurs). These injuries cause massive strain through the top of the hamstring, and injuries sustained here are the slowest hamstring injuries to return from. There was no debating that this season there was a slight increase in significant preseason hamstring injuries as players adjusted to different training loads, however as the players became used to this we saw a reduction in severity of injuries during the season.

A hugely promising statistic from season 2022 which was a major success for the strength & conditioning and medical teams was the reduction of time lost to overuse tendon injuries and bone stress injuries. Four players in preseason missed on average 30 days related to medial tibial stress (a massive reduction from an average of 53.3 days in 2021) and we saw little to no time loss due to tendon overuse injuries. Tibial stress has historically caused major time loss in preseason and early season rounds for the Club. Medical staff have continued to make players aware of its severity and long-term impact and encouraged players to report symptoms early to prevent long periods of time loss and closely monitored at risk player training loads. Equally huge credit must go to the consistent monitoring of loads by the strength & conditioning team and coaches played a large part in avoiding these injuries.

With preseason around the corner, the medical team is gearing up for season 2023 and look forward to being involved with the players, staff and supporters of the Club for what is hopefully another successful season across the grades. We continue to aim to provide the players with the highest level of care and work alongside the coaches and strength and conditioning staff to keep our injury rates as low as possible, while minimising time lost for injured players. We will continue to reflect on previous seasons to form our goals for the year ahead, and for 2023 one of our major goals will be to reduce rate and severity of hamstring injuries.

We as a group would again like to thank the coaching and strength & conditioning staff, players and SUFC as an organisation for a great year that was and for the ongoing support we are lucky enough to receive.

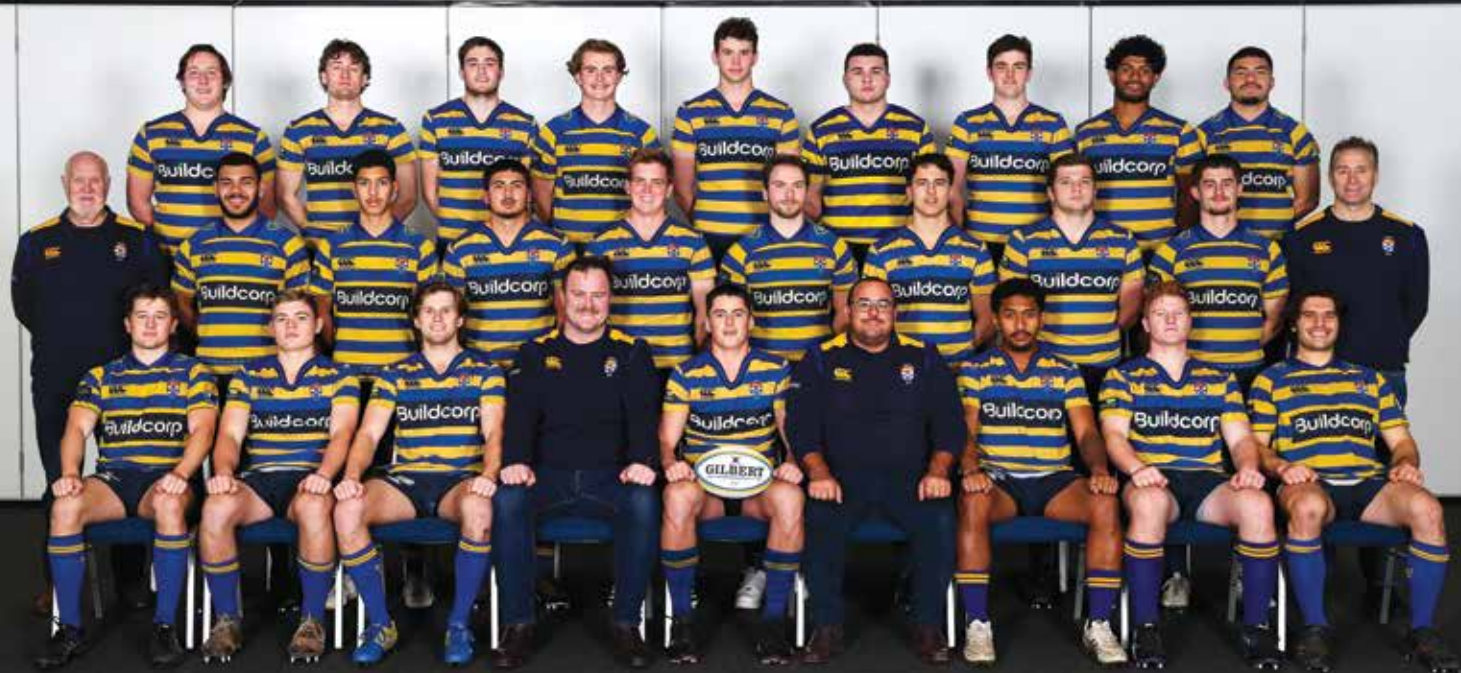

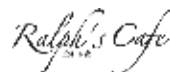
